If you do not have a mute button, you may mute by pressing the star key followed by the number six (*6). You can unmute by pressing the same keys (*6). To "raise your hand" on the phone, dial *9 when the item you wish to speak on has begun. When the chair calls for public comment, you will be announced when it is your turn to speak, and your microphone will be unmuted. Comments from the public are limited to 3 minutes per speaker.

SUBJECT: Endorsement of a Proposed Map for New Santa Barbara County Supervisor Districts

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2021-87, endorsing a proposed map or maps previously submitted to the Citizen Commission on Redistricting Supervisor Districts for Santa Barbara County.

BACKGROUND:

Every 10 years, local governments use new data from the Census to redraw their district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. State law requires cities and counties to engage communities in the redistricting process by holding public hearings and doing public outreach, including to non-English-speaking communities.

In the November 2018 Statewide General Election, county voters approved Measure G that formed an 11-member independent redistricting commission to establish the electoral district boundaries in Santa Barbara County for the upcoming decade following receipt of the 2020 federal census data. This commission was called the "Citizens Independent Redistricting Commission" (Commission).

The Commission began meeting in January 2021 to review, discuss and deliberate on redistricting statutes, public outreach plans, and mapping tools for constituents to use during a series of public meetings that will be held in each district. The public was encouraged to participate in the redistricting process by submitting proposed maps for the new supervisor districts. The Commission's website (www.drawsantabarbara.org) provided information and online resources to allow interested persons to draw proposed district maps either on paper or by using an online, interactive map. The information including the various criteria that will be used by the Commission to select the final map.

DISCUSSION:

The City Council received a presentation from a 1st District representative of the Commission (Karen Twibell) at its regular Council meeting on November 9, 2021. Ms. Twibell advised the Council and members of the public that the deadline to submit a map had been extended until Friday, November 12, 2021.

During the question-and-answer period of the presentation, several members of the City Council expressed an interest in supporting one or more of the proposed maps that have already been submitted. Because this item had not been agendized as an action item (a presentation is an information-only item), the Council could not take action to endorse a particular map at that time. After further discussion, the Council requested that this matter be placed on a future agenda. Because the Commission will hold its first meeting to deliberate and consider the proposed maps submitted by the public on November 18, 2021, and its second meeting would be held on November 22, 2021, the City Council did not want to wait until its next regular City Council meeting on November 23, 2021, to consider endorsing a proposed map. Since the City Council was already scheduled to participate in a joint City Council/Guadalupe Union School District public meeting beginning at 6 p.m. on November 17, 2021, the City Council directed staff to schedule a special City Council meeting to begin at 5 p.m. on November 17, 2021.

Thereafter, the City Councilmembers were asked to inform City Staff of up to three (3) proposed maps they would like for the full Council to consider no later than by Noon on Monday, November 15, 2021. Councilmembers were not required to submit three (3) maps, or any at all, but were asked to submit no more than three (3) choices each to keep the number of proposed maps to a manageable number.


Should the City Council not have enough time to complete its deliberations and/or conduct a vote on a proposed map to endorse before the joint City Council/School District meeting begins at 6 p.m., the Council may vote to recess the meeting until after the joint meeting with the School District is over, and then, may return to conclude their deliberations and/or hold a vote. Alternatively, the Council can adjourn the meeting to the following day or another day of its choice within five (5) calendar days.

City Councilmembers that provided up to three (3) proposed maps did so and these maps are attached to this report at Attachment 1.
