Management Objectives:

- Provide for the emergency personnel and public safety at all times
- Provide coordinated and unified planning of all operational efforts
- Provide timely updates and bulletins
- Ensure coordinated, timely and accurate release of public information
- Effectively liaison and represent the interest of the City of Guadalupe with the Santa Barbara County Office of Emergency Management and the Public Health Department
- Foster and maintain relationships in Guadalupe with stakeholders, businesses, residents and schools
- Work with non-profit agencies to assist residents if necessary

Control Objectives;

- Support and coordinate unified planning, response, and recovery from Public Health Department COVID-19 emergency
- Manage and facilitate the allocation of scarce logistical resources
- Maintain accountability of all potential exposed emergency personnel
- Develop contingency plans for the isolation/quarantine of exposed Guadalupe first responders
- Develop and disseminate appropriate emergency guidance
- Enhance situational awareness by providing timely and accurate information
- Develop management evaluation points for proactive response to new events resulting from the event
- Developing appropriate shelter in place guidelines

Every member of our community deserves to be as safe as they can be during this pandemic. The Santa Barbara County Public Health Department has posted a webpage of videos of COVID-19 information in the Mixteco language. It includes four quick public service announcement (PSA) videos of about 30 seconds each, and one longer video of about 4.5 minutes. These videos provide the information that every person needs to enhance their safety during this epidemic. The videos include:

- PSA 1 – COVID-19 Explanation – Explicando el COVID-19 – Mixteco Alto – 30 sec
- PSA 2 – Handwashing – Lávase las manos – Mixteco Alto – 30 sec
- PSA 3 – Social Distancing – Distanciamiento social – Mixteco Alto – 30 sec
- PSA 4 – Stay At Home – Quédese en casa – Mixteco Alto – 30 sec.
- Understanding COVID-19 – Entendiendo el COVID-19 – Mixteco Bajo – 4.5 min

These videos are free to use and share online. We hope they will be helpful to our Mixteco-speaking neighbors and the agencies, schools, and clinics that serve them. Either the whole page or individual videos can be shared, and they are free to post on websites, social media, television and so on.
