MEETING OF THE RECREATION AND PARKS COMMISSION
WEDNESDAY, JUNE 8, 2022

Call to Order: Recreation Commission Chair- Joe Harris called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Roll Call: Recreation Manager, Hannah Fuentes, noted the Commissioner attendance as follows:

Pledge of Allegiance:

Commissioner Chair Joe Harris was recognized and led the Commission in the pledge of allegiance.

Community Participation Forum:

No participation.

Consent Calendar:

1. Motion was made by **Salinas**, seconded by **Dreiling** to approve the April 13, 2022, minutes. All ayes, 4/0. Motion passed.

Regular Business:

1. **LeRoy Community Center Use Presentations**

a. **Allan Hancock College**

LeeAnne McNulty and Stephanie Robb attended the meeting and presented on behalf of Allan Hancock College. Ms. McNulty presented background information on Allan Hancock College. Hancock College services Santa Maria, Lompoc, and the Santa Ynez Valley. They serve a population of over 400,000 with some of the most economically disadvantaged families on the Central Coast.

Hancock's use of LeRoy Community Center would be to provide early registration for participants, provide information on admissions and records policies, provide additional support services to those who qualify, provide workshops on completing the FAFSA and other various scholarships and financial aid, provide career exploration activities, provide workshops on job applications and resumes, provide a counselor to support students, develop education plans, provide

transcript evaluations and certification of general education patterns, provide group and individuals assistance and tutoring, and support services provided to those who qualify. The goal of this program is to serve all residents of the Guadalupe area regardless of age, gender, or background. Because this is a pilot program, and the grant has not been awarded yet, Hancock will coordinate with the Recreation Department upon being awarded the grant.

b. Boys and Girls Club

Michael Boyer, CEO; Roberto Rodriguez, Chief of Operations & Accountability; and Carmen Mendoza, Guadalupe Area Director attended the meeting on behalf of the Boys and Girls Club. They presented background information on the Boys and Girls Club and their previous experience with the City of Guadalupe.

The plan to implement the following programs: Brain Gain, Keystone: The Ultimate Teen Program, Image Makers, Smart Girls, Passport 2 Manhood, National Arts Contest, Torch Club, Triple Play, and Drama Matters.

The program cost per member is \$50 for the 180 day after school program and \$50 per week for week long breaks. No member is turned away for inability to pay. They presented a requested schedule of Monday – Friday after school. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday the use would be from 2pm – 6pm. Wednesdays would be 1pm – 6pm on early release days. During breaks and Non-School days, they request a 7:30am – 5:30pm schedule. Their ratio of staff to participants is 1:20, but they did discuss that it may change to 1:15. They are open to working with other organizations in the community to share space at LeRoy Community Center.

c. SER Jobs for Progress

Michael Jimenez attended the meeting on behalf of SER Jobs for Progress. SER Jobs for Progress wants to replicate some of the programs that already exist at their Fresno site. Their goal is to implement a Center for Arts and Technology. Some of the programs are digital tv production, digital design, music classes, GED program for farm workers, and national farm workers jobs programs. It is SER’s goal to work with the Boys and Girls Club and any other organizations that wish to utilize LeRoy Community Center to fill in the gaps.

2. **Other matters of importance** – Nothing to report.

3. The Commission requested that the other agenda items be moved to a special meeting as the third commissioner had a schedule conflict and had to leave. This left the commission with only two people.

Adjournment:

At 7:24 p.m. a **Motion** was made by Commissioner **Dreiling**, seconded by Commissioner **Harris** for adjournment. The unanimous vote resulted in the meeting’s closure.

Submission # 2

I currently live in the central valley, but I am from Guadalupe, and my mother still lives there. As a kid my basketball and volleyball teams held practice at Leroy Park, and I have *always* wanted to paint that building, so I *hope* that you will consider my submission.

My concept for the mural is a fun, active painting that points to Guadalupe's history, as well as how the park serves the community:

At the image's center will be a partial reproduction of an iconic vegetable poster from the 1950's, which depicts Guadalupe farmland and the distant foothills.

As the picture spreads out, the color morphs into a pinkish sky, which becomes a backdrop for a group of figures that run and jump towards the edges of the composition.

I think of the figures in this painting in two ways, as a movement of color, where each individual character becomes a unique color arrangement, but also as individuals in the community, moving at their own pace, in their own direction, together.

Attached are three images:

The first two are my submission files. One is an image depicting approximately where the figures will be located, represented as white silhouettes on top of a color background. The other image is a color study of the figures themselves.

The third image is the 1950's poster I mentioned, which I will partially reproduce at center, in the door area.

Once again, I hope that you will consider my application. Thank you for your time.

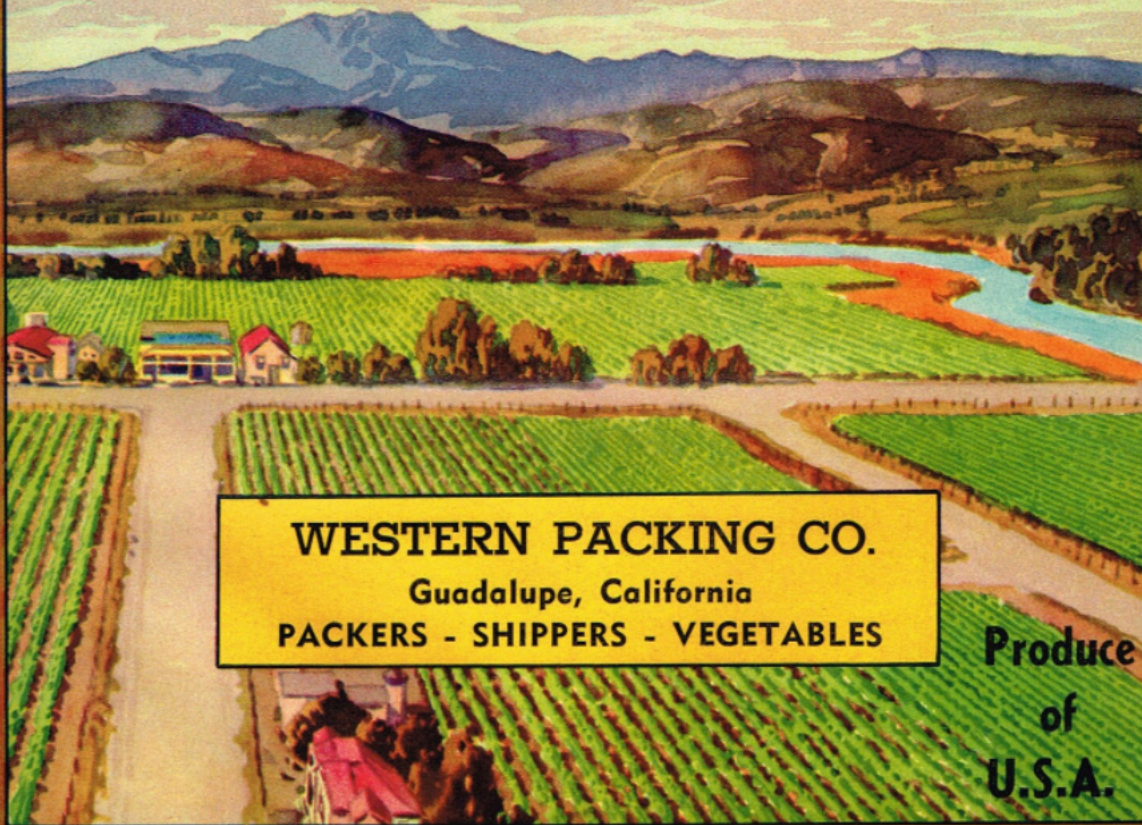

This mural idea depicts Guadalupe's past and present. It has been shown in 3 sections that make up the total distance across of 58'. The left side panel shows the Chumash as the first inhabitants, later Spanish explorers, and the rancho. The center panel shows the rich, and vibrant community of Guadalupe that developed afterwards (dancing, music, classic cars, old water tower.) The right side panel refers to our Guadalupe of today. The images make reference to the new water tower, working and playing together, growing food, being surrounded by agricultural fields, the nearby dunes and ocean, beautiful sunsets and daytime skies.
