DEFINITION

Under general direction of the Fire Captain, performs firefighting, emergency medical care; participates in public education activities and/or fire prevention activities; responds to public service incidents; cares for station, fire apparatus and related fire equipment. Participates in training activities and performs other duties, as assigned.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Responds to fire and other emergency alarms.
- Tests, maintains, and operates fire equipment and assists in the suppression of fire.
- Assists with fire prevention activities.
- Administers emergency medical care and rescue.
- Maintains fire station and grounds.
- Answers telephone and radio equipment, as needed.
- Participates in related training programs and drills.
- May be required to act as Fire Captain on a temporary basis.

KNOWLEDGE/SKILLS

- Principles, practices, techniques of fire suppression and prevention activities.
- Principles, practices, and skills of emergency medical care, including Cardio pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automatic External Defibrillation (AED).
- Basic principles of mechanics, fire hydraulics, and math.
- Basic principles of Incident Command System.
- Knowledge of streets and hydrants within the City's automatic mutual aid area.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with co-workers and the public.
- Ability to read, understand and apply a variety of fire suppression, prevention information and materials.
- Ability to perform arduous work under adverse and often dangerous conditions.
- Ability to reason and act decisively, quickly, and calmly in emergency situations, under minimal or no direct supervision.
- Knowledge and application of variety of fire suppression techniques, preventive information, and materials.

- California State Fire Marshal Firefighter I (within one year of hire).
- Minimum of one (1) year of firefighting experience.
- Currently certified as EMT (EMT I, certification must meet the requirements of Title 22, California Code of Regulations).
- Possess Driver Operator 1A and 1B Certificates, State of California Fire Marshal (within one year of hire).
- Possess a minimum of a Valid California Class A or B Driver's License with air brake and tanker endorsement or possess a valid Class C Driver's License with a Firefighter endorsement (within one year of hire).
- American Heart Association Healthcare CPR and AED certified.
